

On Tuesday, November 20, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. Town Board Chair Greg Anderson called the regular monthly Town Board meeting to order. Other Supervisors present were Eugene Stoeckel, Jim Kusler, and Mark Riverblood. Supervisor Thomas Duden was absent.

### **Approve Minutes**

A motion was made by Eugene Stoeckel and seconded by Jim Kusler to approve the minutes of the October 16, 2018 regular monthly meeting as printed. Motion Carried.

### **Approve Financial Report**

A motion was made by Mark Riverblood and seconded by Jim Kusler to approve the Financial Report for October 2018 as submitted. Beginning Balance of Township funds was \$692,713.46; total receipts of \$7,054.63; total disbursements of \$20,204.37; leaving a balance of \$679,563.72. Motion Carried Unanimously.

### **Old Business**

There was no old business on the agenda.

### **New Business**

The first item under New Business was to discuss the Minimum Maintenance Road. Joe Toth explained that because of some vandalizing and trespassing, he would like to get the neighbors involved and talk about privatizing the road.

Greg Anderson stated that issue was discussed some years back and it was decided it was not a good idea because when properties are sold or handed down, new property owners may not get along and there will be disputes. The Board agreed that abandoning the road would not be the best option and talked about improving the road a little to make it more accessible.

Eugene Stoeckel motioned to request that West Branch Construction come up with a minimum plan to improve the road. Mark Riverblood seconded the motion to get a quote to consider and wanted to note that after receiving the quote, they would need to know if there is anyone still pursuing a request to abandon the road because it is not in the Township's best interest to spend money on a road and at the same time consider a vacation.

The next item on the agenda was a Moratorium on Cul-de-sacs. Greg Anderson explained that the moratorium was to give the Planning Commission time to review the Ordinances in relation to cul-de-sacs.

Eugene Stoeckel motioned to approve Resolution 2018-5, establishing a moratorium on the creation or extensions of cul-de-sacs within Princeton Township. Mark Riverblood seconded the motion. Mark Riverblood also stated that the Planning Commission was in the process of looking at a number of different aspects in the Subdivision Ordinances. Motion Carried.

John Roxbury, Jr. explained that the Planning Commission is going to continue reviewing the Ordinances and will present something to the Board in the near future.

Eugene Stoeckel motioned to approve the 2019 Office Closed Dates. Jim Kusler seconded the motion. Motion Carried.

Jim Kusler motioned to approve the 2019 Meeting Schedule. Eugene Stoeckel seconded the motion. Motion Carried.

### **Open Forum**

There were no residents who wished to speak.

### **Supervisors Report**

Mr. Stoeckel gave an update on the Airport Advisory Committee and the City Planning Commission.

Jim Kusler stated that he will continue with Ordinance discussions at the Planning Commission meetings.

Mark Riverblood stated that he spoke with the Administrator at the City of Princeton and asked him to provide the Township with detailed information about why the new fire trucks are needed, why the old trucks are not serviceable and a plan and projection as to the impact to the Township. The Administrator stated that he would get more information to the Township before the December Board meeting.

### **Clerks Business**

The Clerk did not have any business to address.

### **Approve Payment of the Bills**

A motion was made by Eugene Stoeckel and seconded by Jim Kusler to approve payment of the bills, Check numbers 12195-12244. Motion Carried.

### **Adjourn**

A motion was made by Mark Riverblood and seconded by Eugene Stoeckel to adjourn the meeting at 8:11 p.m. Motion Carried.
